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Realistic common knowledge

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Logical games are used both to define validity, as in the Dialogic Logic tradition, and to define truth, as in the Game-theoretical approach of Hintikka and Sandu. I propose to have a closer look at the link between the two approaches: I will show precisely how winning strategies on the first ones can be turned into winning strategies on the second one in the case of FOL, and I will discuss the significance of cut-elimination like combination of strategies in this context.
